The poster session serves to highlight the broad capabilities and research of the life science industry in Tennessee.

Poster Guidelines

Posters should present data from specific research projects and adhere to the following guidelines:

- Maximum size is 72 inches wide by 48 inches high. Oversized posters cannot be accommodated.
- An abstract must be submitted corresponding to the title and content of the poster.
- Include all funding sources and conflicts of interest on the poster.

How to Submit

Please submit a poster abstract by Monday, Sept. 15 to acate@lifesciencetn.org. The abstract limit is 2,300 characters. You will be notified if your acceptance by Wednesday, Sept 17.

Abstract content and editing are the responsibility of the submitting author. Abstracts will be published as received. Please review your abstract prior to submission to ensure accuracy (co-authors, funding recognition, etc.).

Submission of an abstract is free. Those students that submit their abstracts by September 15 and are selected will receive a complimentary conference registration.
