Instructions for submitting photos from your public health practicum

Technical specifications:

- High-resolution photos
- Photo sizes should be at least 800 x 600 pixels
- JPEG files only



What kinds of photos to submit:

- Photos of you “at work” at your practicum site
- This will require you to ask someone else to take your picture (*one or two selfies are fine, but include some more formal shots as well*)
- It’s often easier to stage pictures, just make sure they realistically portray your practicum work
- Be overly respectful of patient privacy and always ask permission before taking photos with others

Need some inspiration?

- Think about a series of shots that portray your “typical day in the life” at your practicum site
- Show us something specific to, or unique or special about your practicum setting

Caption information:

Include the following information for each photo you upload –

- **Who** is pictured (full names when possible)
- **What** is taking place in the photo
- **Where** you are located
- **When** you took the photo (approximately)
